Leader 1: We light candles in Advent as a sign of the coming light of Christ. Advent means "coming".

Leader 2: We are preparing ourselves for the days when the nations shall beat their

swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks.

Leader 3: Nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they study war any more.

Leader 4: This second week of Advent, we light the second candle, to welcome Christ our Peace.

A leader lights two candles on the ring. Leaders and people then say:

All: Come, Lord Jesus.
