

OURS IS AN OPEN COMMUNION. All Christians are encouraged to join in celebrating the Lord's Supper today. This includes children whose parents deem it appropriate and who have instructed their children about the meaning of Communion. For greater inclusivity, all the bread being served is gluten free, and all wine is unfermented grape juice.

This morning we commune by intinction. The bread is gluten-free. For those with other food allergies, a separate bowl of wafers are available that are free of gluten, wheat, yeast, dairy, egg, soy, nuts and corn. If you have need of those wafers, please indicate that to the pastor when you come forward to receive the sacrament. You will also be provided with a separate cup of grape juice for dipping, reserved for those receiving the allergen-free wafers.
